Carriage Rides

Enjoy a relaxing 30-minute ride down Mountain View Road and hear the vintage clip-clop of horse hooves as you gaze at our surrounding mountain peaks. Every day, weather permitting. Rides every half-hour Sunday through Thursday from 4-6 p.m. and Friday and Saturday from 6-8 p.m. \$65 per ride.

Horse Whispering 101

For horse lovers novice to expert. Learn to read horse expressions and how your personal energy affects horse behavior and can build trust. 90-minute sessions for \$75 per person.

Pony Rides

Meet one of our full-size horses for a 5-minute ride. 8:45-9:00 a.m. every day. This isn't just for children, but is a great option for those under the age of 11. Rides are \$10. Pay at Front Desk.

Not Your Average Trail Ride

A great chance to learn how to really connect with a horse. Includes approximately 30 minutes of play time in the ring learning how to go over obstacles in our new playground, then approximately 60 minutes on the trail. We have a bridge, rock walls and other obstacles to test your new skills. For ages 11 and up. Designed for intermediate and advanced levels of riders. \$75 for 90-minute session.

Riding Lessons

A great learning experience for those 6 and up, and for those too young to participate in our Not Your Average Trail Rides. Our youngest riders may be kept tethered to an instructor for safety if needed. If you have never ridden before, this is a great option for you to gain confidence in a ring either one-on-one with an instructor or you may bring a friend. \$75 for a private 60 minute lesson or \$55 for a two or more person 60 minute lesson.

All activities must be booked in advance through the Front Desk or with Concierge.
